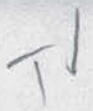

F. 352: soft earth, ^{few} stones & chipples. ~~W.~~ W. of F. 351: digging over top of this produced some pot & bone (sm. frag)

18/7/71

further digging showed soft earth below chipples, and apparent packing stones. when attacked, chipples level continued, to form a deep PH. (54 cms deep from top of hole): width c. 20 cm.

19/7/71

Beginning of clearing around this feature. Finds from clearance labelled F. 352a. This extended to an area of

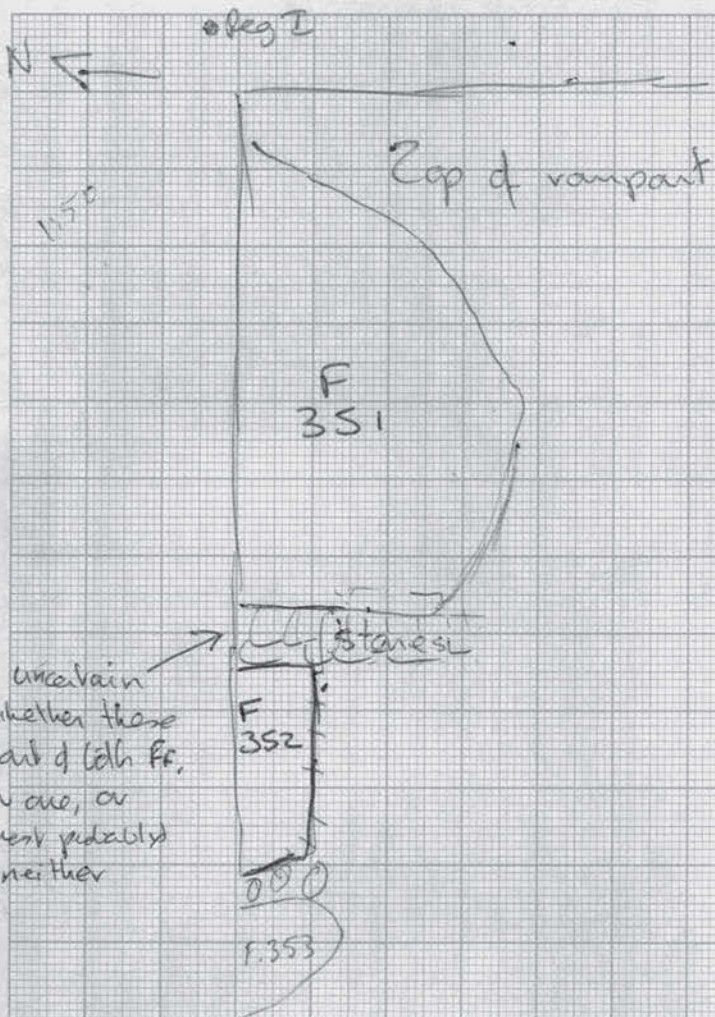
20/7/71

c. 90-100 ^(finally) cms from the edge of F. 352, with soft chipples-earth to the W, and more stony earth to E & SE: many finds,

21/7/71

esp from imm to SE of F. 352; continuation of digging to ^{level of} bottom of F. 352 - ie complete removal of that feature revealed that it was completely surrounded by a lot of softish red earth / chipples, with some black streaks. There were more stones in the earth towards the ~~SE~~ SE, and to the W. the hole seemed to merge with F. 353

There appears to be a gull running NW-SE across 352a: 353 may be solution hollow in the CYLS in this gull. 373 appears in the N section as an intrusion into 352a, which could perhaps be ^(a) geological or (b) an intrusion - coincidentally connected with CYLS, into the earlier bank - i.e. Period I b.
