ASSOCIATED FINDS 1 Pebble and 1 Flint Fragment

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COMMENT This appears to be a rectangular hole, where quarrying has taken place - working from natural fault lines. On removing half, the only finds have been, one pebble and one flint fragment. A few pieces of burnt oolite were present in layer 3 - remarkably little comparing this with ditch infills in previous years cuttings, and the lowest layer 4 contained a lot of light coloured earth - I think not usual in the rampart ditches. No evidence to show any rampart tumble lying over the hollow, or having tumbled into the hollow. Another hollow nearby, between the rampart and F1000, appears not to have rampart tumble over this either, being covered by chipples, most of these showing signs of burning.
