F1228 Appearance at level \odot 15 cms circular area of disturbed
B/F3 - B/G3 junction stone approx 70 cms diam, situated on N edge of
Trench (see F1218 + F1219). ^{fairly irregular} ~~irregular~~ hole decreasing
^{& irregularly} in diam/going down. Considerable burning. Some flint and other
finds incl much pottery

(some post)
Section drawn. Nail A (B/G3): NE 2.01 NW 9.98. B (B/F3): NW 2.79
NE 9.70
Most of the pottery came from the very bottom of the hole; and, of this, largely from
area marked \odot on plan.

9th Aug. same day: rest taken out. NE top area taken out separately (defined by 2
stones marked α and β opposite). The stones in this section obey the
lines implied by α and β ; on E side, generally flat; on W side,
sloping. Beyond this area to N & W, stones, by contrast, frequently
vertical.

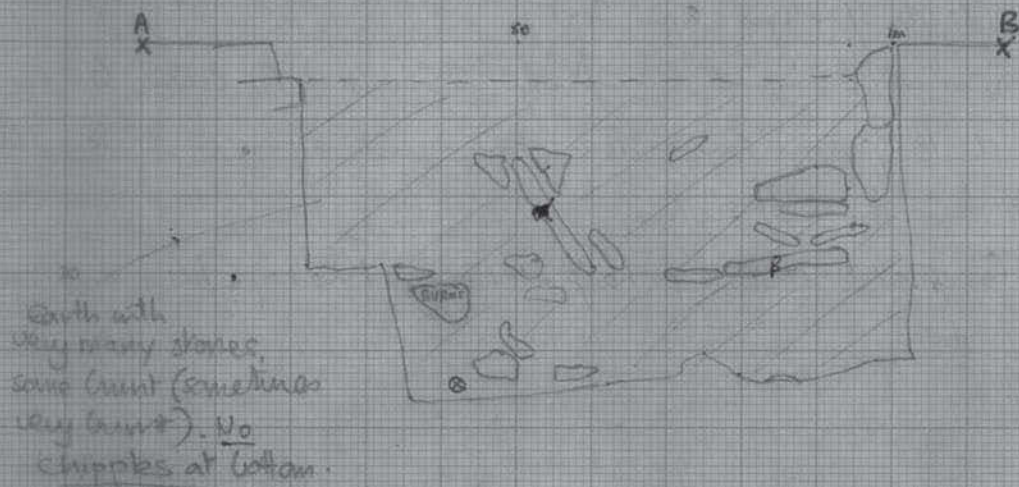

Finds in this area small (4 items, bagged separately). This
coheres with S part, where ^{the counterpart to} this area also rendered few
finds compared with the bit below it. Also, little burning.
Below it, more burning ~~but not~~ (though less than in S half)
& much pottery, usually again very close to bottom.

1 (c.j.w.) reckon this P.H. was reused without being recut; the first
occupation, associated with most of the pottery & the burning, cut the hole;
the second ~~cut~~ cut an area of about 1/3 the total size and lined
it with large (unburnt) stones. This occupation would not then
have been burnt out (in this P.H. at least).
