

DITCH 2105.

This is the continuation of the ditch after the causeway. The top 70cm of so of the fill was of gull material, and only one of the edges was distinctly visible. A fairly solid layer was then reached, though loose gull material did continue, maybe as a pit, in one part. Once taken down a cleared picture emerged. There was no continuation of the ditch from CI but rather the causeway, once the wall had been removed, continued across the cutting almost up to the bench line which had separated CI and CIV. The depth of this hollowed out causeway was 80cm and was filled in part with what must have been redeposited gull material. A section was cut through this hollow causeway gull material and is on page 10. The fate of the CI ditch is sealed - by backfill.

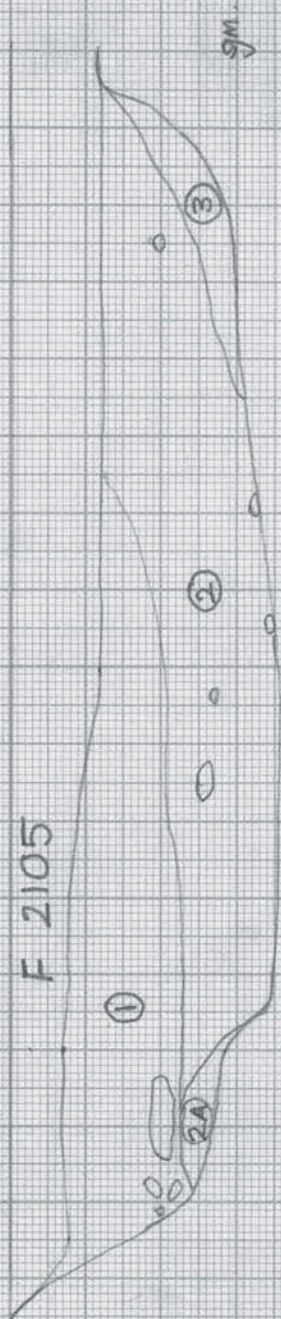
