SCOOP - Immediately after deturfing this showed up as an area of disturbance i.e. some large upturned stones and a mass of small stones in a loose fill. On investigation this appeared to be a natural feature, the sort of disturbance normally associated with tree root action. But at a lower level burnt limestone began to show up in the vicinity of this hollow, and so prompted further investigation. Upon sectioning this appeared to be a feature similar

in character to F2127; that is an ill defined depression or scoop, but in this case with very few finds, and these being only flint. Like F2127 this feature also continues into the cutting section of P2 and so a cutting section has also been drawn.
