

SITE *C.H. '79*CONTEXT *F. 3413*CUTTING *B6 (65E, 20N)*DATE EXPOSED *31-7-79*DATE COMPLETED *6-8-79*DESCRIPTION *Large double pit-hole. Indicated by smaller stones surrounded by bedrock in surface after removal of site layer (2) on level plan. Remains in middle of solid bedrock sides, stepped here deeper in West.**Fill: past side extremely tightly packed horizontal limestone slabs especially towards top. Some burnt limestone randomly mixed with unburnt. West side lower packed slabs & east, some*MAX. WIDTH AND DIRECTION *175 cm N-S packing slabs indicating pit pit: west*MAX. LENGTH AND DIRECTION *110 cm E-W*MAX. DEPTH/HEIGHT THICKNESS *83 cm*OVERLIES *Bedrock*OVERLAIN BY *site layers 1 & 2*CUTS *Bedrock*

COMMENT The fill of this feature suggests that the pit-hole was originally in the east & that this was deliberately filled up & the later pit-hole situated to the west (very slightly to the north) although a good part of it must have overlapped with the position of the original pit-hole. The west of the feature is also slightly deeper.

The western pit-hole was similar in size & fill to F 3406 suggesting these two pit-holes belonged to part of the same structure possibly a large 4 potter. (Other 2 pit-holes could have been in B7)
