WORN SUB-FLOOR SURFACE.

Matrix is reddish/brown soil with small stones (2cm across)

Matrix is yellow brown of lots of droppings with little soil. (2.5 cm across)

Datum Zero \equiv 5,31 E; 3,40 N.


Datum Hundred \equiv 6,31 E; 3,40 N.

At a depth of 30cm below datum, there was a layer of stones which were burnt. This layer covered all of F3950.

The size of them was \sim 10cm across.

The p.h. 3950 is contemporary with the worn sub-floor surface 3953: the latter was packed in around the top of the former post, but laid over the earlier & probably disused p.h. 3970.
