COMMENT Although at first this apparent layer looked as if it were a man-deposited layer cut by 8347, subsequent excavation showed that it must have been merely a degraded edge-of-fissure weathering product. Some tiny burnt stones were found in it, but these had no doubt trickled down by natural action.
