COMMENT *This is a problematical layer in that its marked wear is difficult to account for. Although it is worn it does seem to be associated with the P.2 wall 8601. ie it seems to be partly a foundation for it. However, some rocks beneath 8601 are un worn, and it may be that 8660 was in part used as a walking surface during the construction of the rampart.*
