## Comments

Period of build uncertain: could be a later addition to 10718, but in the absence of a N. face to 10718, the mass could simply be an original addition to it i.e. tiered construction of rampart.

This rubble mass is partly laid with many of the stones pitched. on balance it is perhaps not a rubble but maybe a partly laid pro rampart core with 10763 + 10760 as its S-wall.

It is assumed that much of this core rubble  
has fallen down the hillside along with a now  
completely absent west (N.) wall.
