earth under it, and the edging rock slabs inserted around the edges  
— these vertical edges standing up above ground level, and down  
the sides of the hearth slab.

Under layer ③ there was no burning on the bedrock at all, and the hearth slab burnt and reddened only to less than half its thickness.

Area of upturned pink / burnt stones forming a square, just north of F800 — possibly a hearth — now definitely a hearth.
