could be seen. The eastern upper edges of this small post hole were none existent, and the hole excavated above it filled with large & small stones in dark earth.

The lower part ② or small Post Hole was completely filled with light coloured chipples with a very definite sealing of dark earth, although in this drawing the stones from immediately above the small post are removed and the far edge of cut bedrock forming the southern Post Hole edge has been drawn - this is because section was further back = south.

After this stage of drawing, removed left hand side bit of section to find what could possibly be another small post hole ③.
