COMMENT

On cleaning, this seemed not to be a distinct feature i.e. not a p.h., but the wall-like belt of stones remained, running E-wards into the mass of confusing wall collapses S. of 7564.

PHASING *NB: on excavation, this feature was found to consist of upper stones pitching into a small p.h. The upper stones may reasonably be ascribed to the 7534 wall (P. 4a), but the underlying p.h. could be 4a or earlier.*
