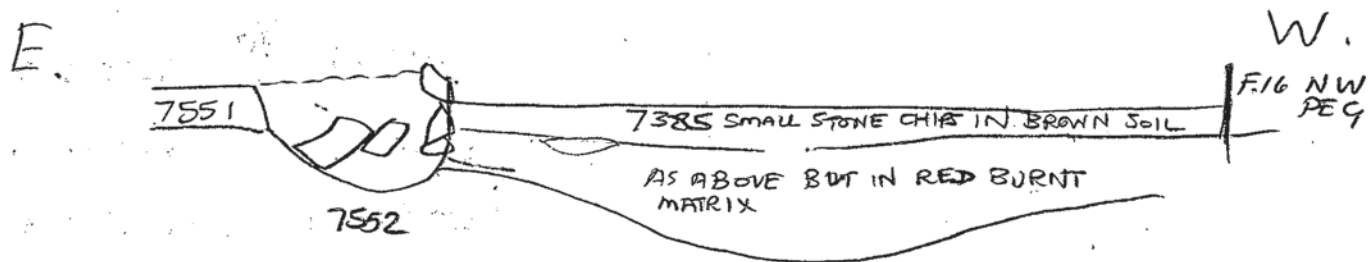
COMMENT *? Remains of wall. 19-8-86: on removal of the upper large stones, this feature was shown to be a <sup>narrow</sup> linear NS one of embedded stones, mostly upright, overlain by chipmunk & small stone spreads into which 7535 wall was dug. 7552 pre-dates the 7535 house, and can perhaps be related to the curved <sup>(7396)</sup> stake holes (of which 7395 is one) in F.15.*

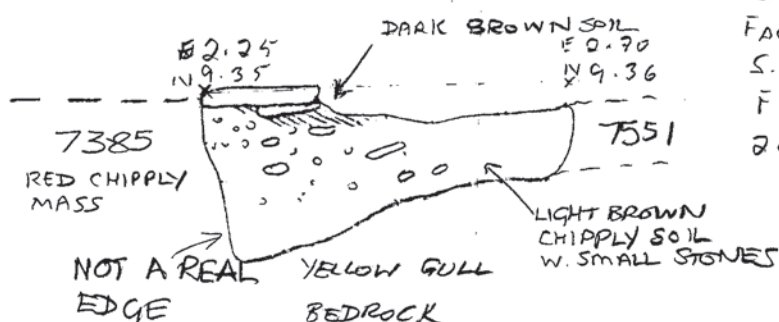
