*This is a p.h., pre-dating the rectangular structure 7535. It is full of dark grey soil with medium & large stones, many of which are burnt.*

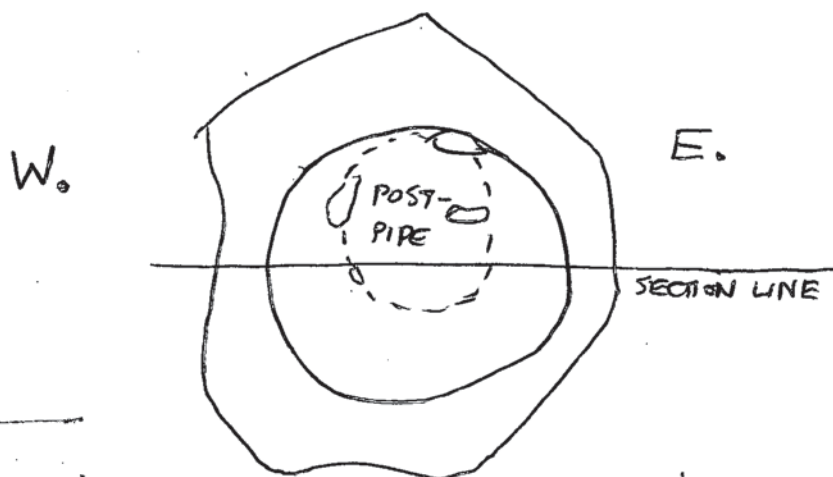

P.h. has a central post pipe<sup>③</sup>, the surviving top of which was at 32 cm above the bedrock bottom. The upper fill of the p.h. consisted of two layers, ① a top layer of medium sized rubble with brown soil; ② a middle layer of darker brown soil with some small stones. Both of these sank down into the top of the post pipe.

The post pipe had survived only in its bottom 20 cm.
