layers to the West and the layers above is not clear. The top gully layer, 1469①, seemed to merge with 1183③, but can be regarded as underlying it.

~~PHASE~~ The gully was found to be just over three metres long, and sawage shaped, with no apparent function. Two sherds of black gritted ware were recovered from its infill.

Both components of its infill contained burnt stones, and 1469② comprised a red/brown soil with many burnt stones. One drawing inc.
