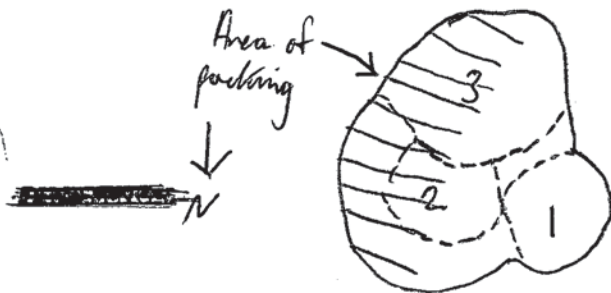

All three post holes would have been pre-1183. The packing stones were concentrated on the East side of the Post Hole. This therefore argues that posthole ① was not the first post hole. However, the base of ① had been cut by the later post holes.
