ASSOCIATED FEATURES 7259, 7319

ASSOCIATED FINDS *Pot, May Hill grit, burnt clay, pebbles, shotgun pellets, charcoal, daub, burnt tooth, burnt bones, bone, metal, tooth, flint, alien limestone, alien stone*

COMMENT *Area increased north-eastwards as soil was removed from it and from 7212, chaffle from which originally covered characteristic 7211 material. A considerable number of burnt stones, isolated or in small patches, some associated with the few large stones, were evident from the outset, and removal of the last of the soil revealed a groove with many small burnt stones forming its base outlining a semi-circle in the southern half of the area (7262). The removal of all the small stones that formed part of the characteristic material of the area (7259/60) revealed a number of patches of medium-to-large stones, 7284, 7285, 7287, 7720, but these seemed to be natural features.*
