ASSOCIATED FINDS Bone, alien stone, pot, burnt tooth, daub, charcoal

COMMENT The density of finds that appeared in the soil remaining after Litt. layer 1 had been removed was greater than in 7212 generally. The later removal of 12-3 cm of shingle from the area produced only a few more pieces of charcoal and burnt bone. However, when 7252, comprising the stones in the s.w. corner of 7226, was sectioned as a possible posthole at a later stage, Litt. greater depth produced a considerable number of similar finds. 7252 proved to be amorphous, but part of it and so part of 7226, overlay posthole 7266. There seems to be an even closer spatial relationship between the denser concentration of finds numbered 7225, also noticed early and the posthole 7280, pair to 7266 in the F. H. Longhouse. Only a little more soil/shingle was cleared from the 7226/7252/7266 area before the angled stones of 7266 were noticed.
