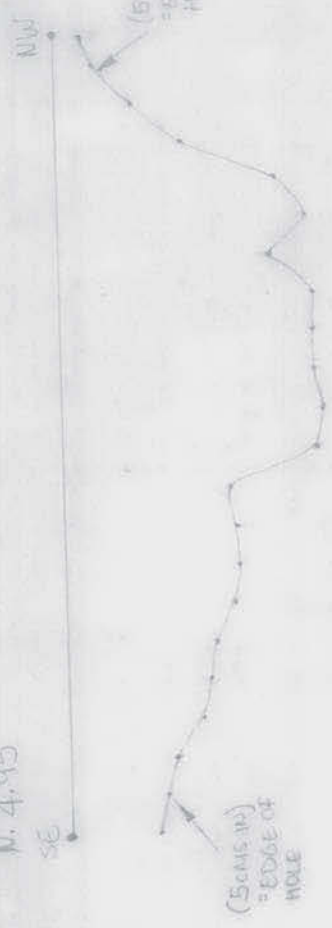

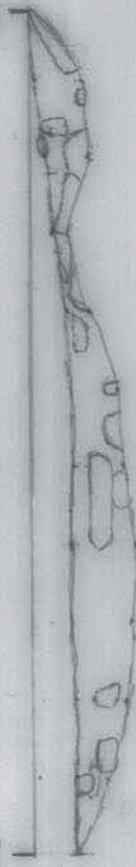

PHASING

(Soil from below projecting stones Layer 3.)
The posthole continued to produce quantities of charcoal right to its bottom. A patch of light orange material occurred below large angled stones above a bedrock shelf (see 7709) on the n. side and on the n.e. to e. edge (Layer 4). Similar and darker orange material was found in posthole 7280 (see 7705, 7707 and 7714). Connected stones in 7709 and 7714 were not removed for lack of time, but it seems probable that 7227 connected with 7280 via the modified postholes 7709 and 7714. Many stones in 7227 were concreted.

A number of mistakes were made in the layer numbers for 7227. These have been corrected, as far as was possible, in the field books but not on the cards with the samples. There remain some doubtful layer numbers. This list is the best I can do.
R.R.H.

Layer 1 (not so distinguished on the cards, with dates near the end of July or the very beginning of August)
Plain brown colour. Nos. 13, 14, 15, 20. (Should be ①)
If dated 3 or 4 August, Nos. 92, 95, 96, 97, 98, 113 are probably also ①.

Layer 2a (② on cards, with date at end of July or very beginning of August)
Dark grey brown colour. No. 35. (Should be ②a)

Layer 2b (② on cards, with dates between 6 and 9 August)
Plain brown colour. Probably Nos. 202, 205, 206, 211, 212, 218, 225, 227, 234. (Probably ②b)
(Nos. 399, 400, 412 may be 2a or 2b)

Layer 3 (② on cards, with date of 19 August)
Dark grey brown with much charcoal. Nos. 655, 660. (Should be ③)

Layer 3 (③ on cards, with date of 22 August)
as above Nos. 692, 693. (correct)

Layer 4 (④ on card, with date of 23 August)
Light orange colour No. 724 (correct)

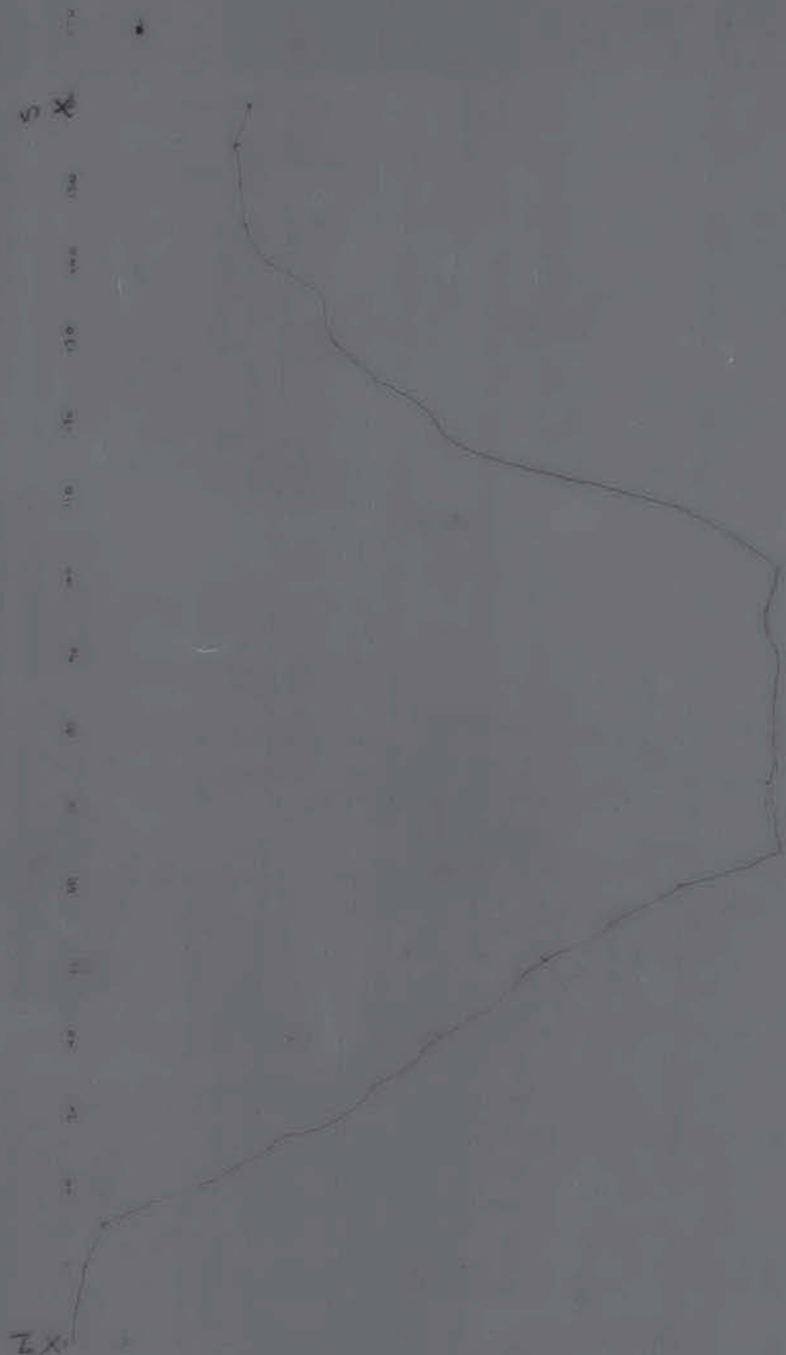
