DESCRIPTION Groove with many very small and some medium-to-large burnt stones outlining a semi-circle with its ends on s. edge of cutting, within which other patches of burnt stones occur

MAX. WIDTH AND DIRECTION 2.00 S/N (radius of area enclosed + groove)
Groove itself 20-30 cm wide

MAX. LENGTH AND DIRECTION 3.00 W/E (diam. of area enclosed + groove)

MAX. DEPTH/HEIGHT THICKNESS 4 cm

ASSOCIATED FEATURES 7222, ?7242, 7292, ?7702, ?7704, 7285

ASSOCIATED FINDS charcoal

COMMENT The area bounded by the groove slopes more gently than other parts of 7211 to n., e. & w. The depression near the s. end of the feature (7242) proved to be above a posthole, but that near the sw. end (7243) did not. Box-sectioning revealed that the burnt stones ran out at c. 4 cm, as did those in a later feature, 7292, not at first recognised as being part of 7232.

PHASING (Pinkish brown soil (7712) was widespread in the area at a lower level, cf. 7702, 7704). ? Removed as part of 7289/7712 (not all cleaned to bedrock).
