ASSOCIATED FEATURES 7226, 7266

ASSOCIATED FINDS Pot, bone, burnt bone, daub, tooth, charcoal

COMMENT Possible posthole — not one: sectioning revealed amorphous bedrock bottom. Soil fill probably the result of root activity. However part of this feature, which had a patch of dark grey-brown soil on its s.w. side, later proved to be part of posthole 7266. The finds in it suggest a relationship between 7266 and 7252, of which it was also part. The concentration of finds in 7226 ran out at no great depth, but the appearance of similar material at a greater depth in 7252 seems to make it more likely that the finds from 7226 relate to the S. A. longhouse, of which 7266 is one posthole.
