ASSOCIATED FEATURES 7289

ASSOCIATED FINDS Flint, burnt bone, charcoal, glass bead,  
? worked stone (No. 1543: given "7289" as feature no. by my mistake)

COMMENT This layer = 7289, in s.e. quarter. (The two parts were given different numbers after two numbers, 7259 and 7260, had been used for the removal of the small stones of 7211.) Removal of c. 5 cm southwards from 5.00 N showed the yellowish brown soil of 7277 soon gave place to a pinkish brown soil (7712), which continued over most of the area to c. 1.30 N. Beyond that point the yellowish brown soil re-appeared, as it did in a small area on the w. edge of the cutting above 7720. The n. part of 7277 was cleaved to bedrock, but the s. part was not, for lack of time.

PHASING Layer between ? D. A. surface and bedrock
