ASSOCIATED FEATURES 7277

ASSOCIATED FINDS charcoal, burnt tooth, alien stone, burnt bone, bone. (No. 1543 should have been given feature no. 7277, not 7289 - my mistake)

COMMENT This layer = 7277, in s. w. quarter, q. v.  
Removal of c. 5 cm from w. side southwards from 3.50 N revealed two small patches of burnt stones (7291 + 7292) and, further s., the posthole 7710 and a more extensive patch of burning (7702 and 7704). Part of the fill of 7710 was a more pinkish brown than the 7289 soil, and all the soil in the area of 7702/04 was this pinkish colour (7712). Lack of time prevented the removal of much of 7289 to bedrock.
