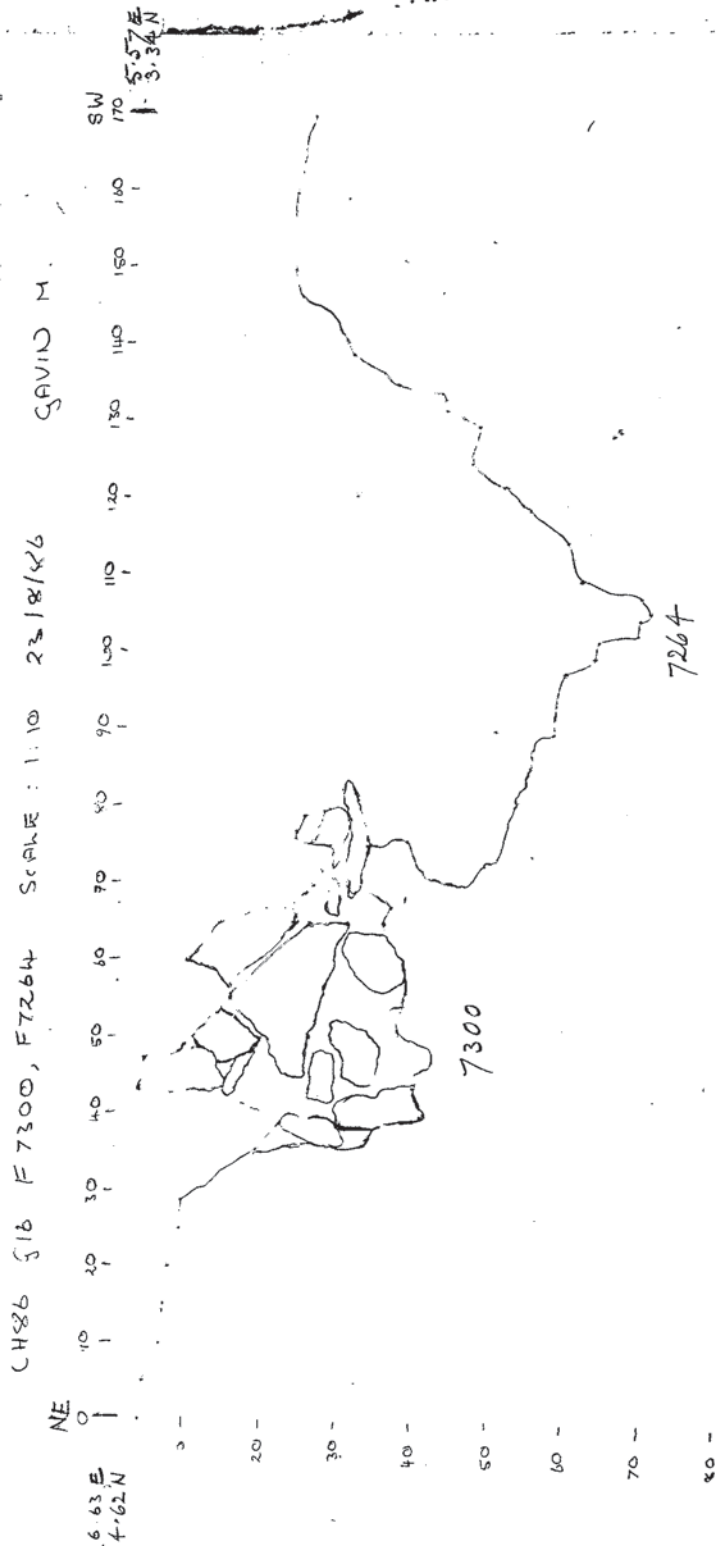

ASSOCIATED FEATURES 7264, 7715 7227/7709, 7280/7714

ASSOCIATED FINDS *Pot, charcoal, daub*COMMENT *Investigated because no clear edge on n.e. side of 7264: proved to be modified posthole (semi-oval shaped) at higher level than 7264 and cut by it. Soil was mainly large stones, unburnt, and large-to-medium-sized stones, some burnt, with only a little soil. Most of the large stones were partly concreted, so that they obscured the edges and bottom for some time, being removed only when similar stones in 7715 proved to be moveable at a later stage (see early section over and revised section profile on back of 7715 sheet). Bottom slopes from 7715 towards 7264.*
