COMMENT Stones on surface of pinkish brown soil, which with small to medium sized stones continued down to uneven bedrock bottom. Unlike 7702, had no edge to any significant height on any side, though, when investigation later extended s. to n. end of 7285, was found that pinkish soil ended at one of the vertical stones of that feature (assumed to be natural). The excavated s. half of which had produced yellowish brown soil. 7704 seems to be the central s. extremity of an extensive area of pinkish brown soil, 7712.
