COMMENT Possible posthole — doubtful.
Near vertical bedrock edge on w. side to only 15 cm, then slope
to bowl-shaped bottom; on e. side, near vertical to only 10 cm,
then slope to shelf above bottom.
Pinkish chippy soil with small burnt stones in upper level,
unburnt stones below in more orangey chippy material.
This range of colour occurs generally in the area (see
7258) but does not seem to be contiguous with either the
more decidedly pink material, 7713, to e. or the
pinkish brown soil, 7712, to s. + s.e.. It is similar
to the 7409 material in F16 and F17 and round 7295/96 in
G16 and, like that, occurs near gull bedrock. It
seems doubtful that it relates to the orange soils in
7280 and 7227, as Dave thought at first it might do.

The section is generally an orange/brown colouration, with a darker tone to the west side. The blank areas of the section consist mainly of small stones + chipples particularly in the middle western sector; there being a light red burnt colour.
