Comment 17.7.74

Sectioned and investigated. Solid bedrock encountered at depth
of 20cm and no very well defined edges found except for an arc
on North west side. If it is a posthole it is a very odd one. Quarter
sectioned. No cut edge found. Fill oolite slabs - some quite

1 large. Dark earth at top, more yellow further down, but
with no marked divide.
