Comment Overlying the pit and extending over a slightly larger area was a fair amount of disturbance or upheaval. This was visible immediately after removing the turf, and some finds ~~was~~ were in this upheaval but only above or within the pit area. Other finds from this area have been recorded as simply ① of the cutting. Certainly there were Flint Flakes
