COMMENT

of the bank on the rest. The exposed bedrock (berm) looked worn, and the ditch edge here was very sharp, almost rectangular. Further south there was some slope towards the ditch, though never so much as on the East side of the ditch, whose West wall is everywhere in this stretch higher than the East ~~BERM~~ wall. Over c. 2m of the South part of the edge of the bank a horizontal shelf, c 60cm wide was cut ~~by~~ mistakenly by a volunteer.
