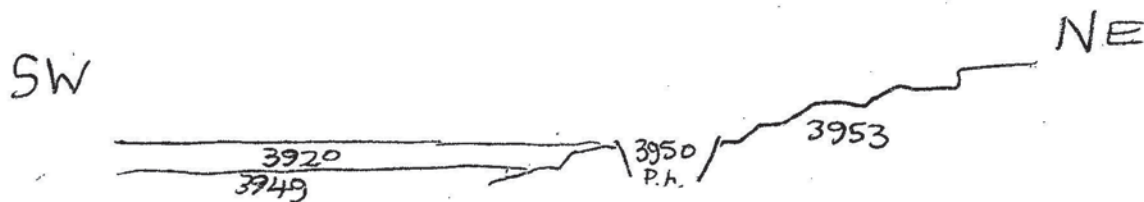
Difficult to assign this area to a period. Much of the stone is smooth - worn? If worn, why is it not completely broken up? Possibly because it was protected by soil, in which case it would not be so worn.

PHASING

All the occupation features of this area seem - superficially - to be related, in that there is a dense concentration of finds and features not matched by any ~~the~~ corresponding densities in L7 or the NE quarter of MT. A structure must have existed in this 3953/3925 area,
