DESCRIPTION

A hollow in the middle of M96 running NW-SE, seeming to be a 1m wide belt. Originally identified by some burnt stones, but later revealed to be a belt, which seemed to mark the northernmost limit of the overlying layer 16507. The 16507 does not extend any further northwards. Has a central line of pitched + vertical medium sized stones with some small burnt ones. At c. 3.2m W of the E cutting edge of M96, the trough-like hollow seems to turn N-wards.
