## DESCRIPTION

Line of small burnt stones to W. of 16505  
A section was excavated at c. 5-8m N. large pitched stones similar  
to those in 15606 dip into the area of burnt material, making it  
appear to be two parallel lines of burning, but the burnt stones seem to lie in a  
round-bottomed trench 0.3m wide. The burning is concentrated in a loose  
soil, possibly equalling posts — a post-trench.

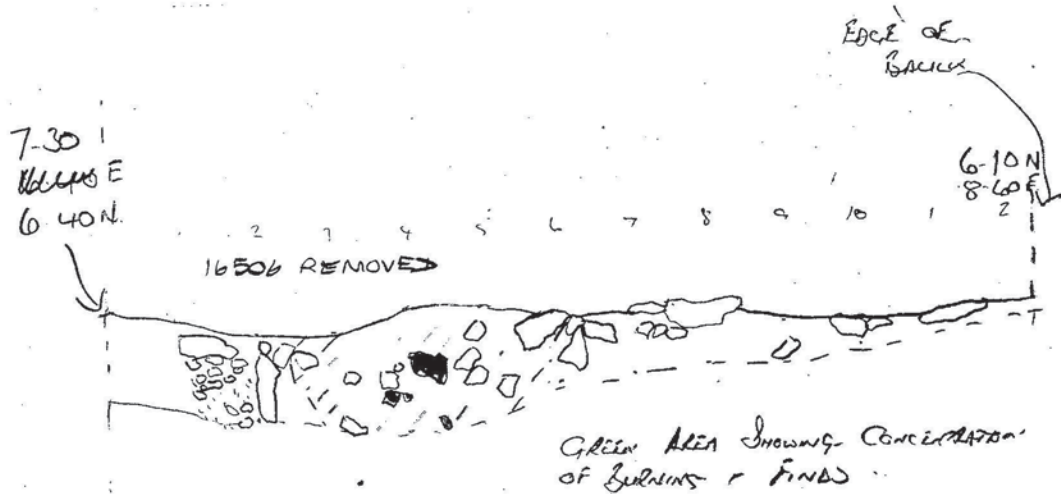

DRAWINGS FOR TRUER VIEW

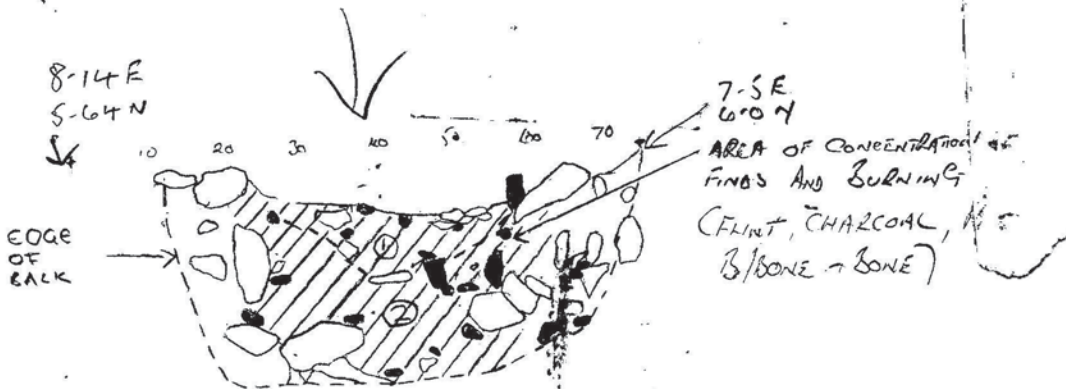
