Hearth
DESCRIPTION An area of concentrated burning, most likely to be the last remnants of a hearth in the South West corner of N99. Original burning can be seen on plan ①, throughout excavation finds of burnt bone, daub, pot and flint were very abundant for an area at least a metre around the concentration. Taken down from this level in plan which revealed a few more burnt stones, noticeably a few upright ones although

ASSOCIATED FINDS burnt bone, pot and flint

COMMENT they were closely packed and showed no obvious signs of being a hearth boundary. Pre-excitation plan at 1:10 available for this level. These stones were sectioned but they would seem to represent the bottom of the hearth as no more burnt stones or finds came up underlying this level. Underlying was a natural (?) depression probably part of F2552 complex. Plan available of second level showing upright burnt stones but not making any clear sense as hearth structure. A section of this revealed nothing, just a part of the F2552 depression. Finds seem to have stopped at the level of plan so we can assume that 1:10 plan shows base of hearth feature
