POSTHOLE This feature was indicated by an area of burnt limestone after the grill had been cleaned down about 2". The layers of fill were as follows; Layer 1 was a mid brown layer with quite large chipples, and it was from this layer that the finds exclusively came; Layer 2 was a light brown layer with fewer though smaller limestone chipples, the consistency of the soil being clayey and full of roots and fungus; Layer 3 was a light yellow, very compacted intrusion which contained a number of small pieces of charcoal. The fill in general contained a relatively large amount of burnt limestone.
