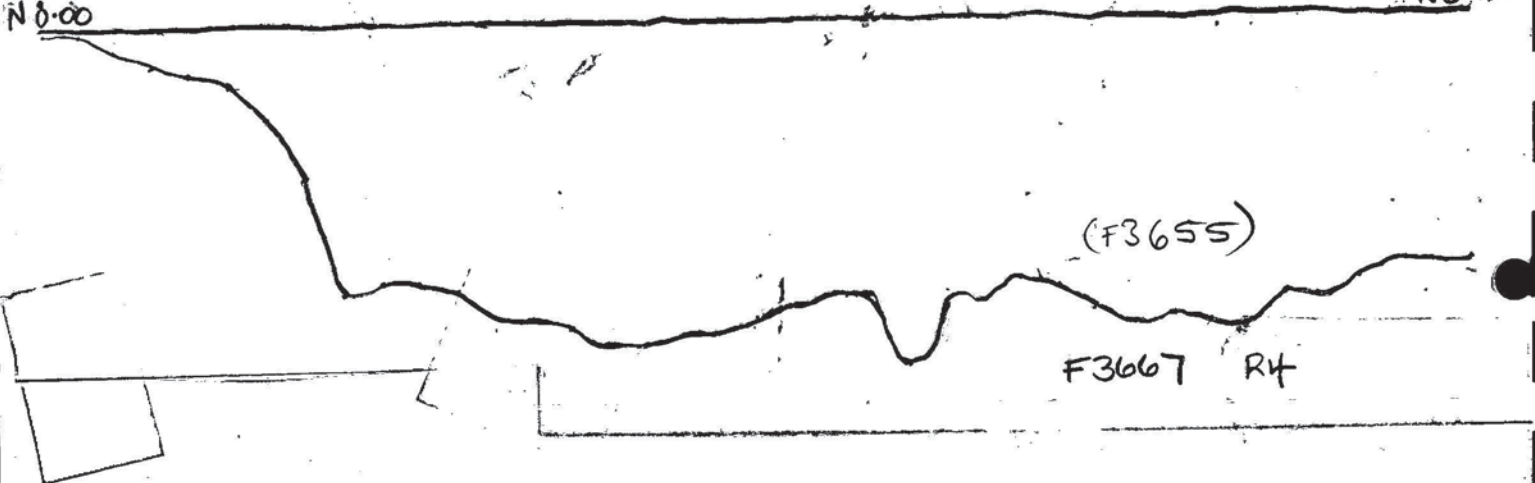

The features within 3667 are more difficult to define as they were all filled with 2961, and could not be spotted higher up, if in fact they were cut into 3667. The features around the northern edge may have been animal burrows, ~~these are likely~~ ~~was~~ they were fairly shallow and oval rather than a definite snake-hole shape.
